The EFN condemns the Russian Federation military conflict and unprecedented aggression against Ukraine

The European Federation of Nurses Associations (EFN) condemns the unprecedented aggression against Ukraine by the Russian Federation and the unacceptable pain, suffering, and loss of lives.

With recent reports of shelling and damage to health facilities, we are deeply concerned about our nurses, midwives and all health professionals in hospitals and health services in Ukraine. Healthcare facilities must not be military targets. The EFN demands that the international principle of medical and health care neutrality is respected, and that the principle of human rights must be upheld and protected. Casualties and patients in Ukraine must have full access to healthcare. Healthcare professionals must not be prevented from performing their professional duties, and any action to prevent or sanction them for carrying out their duty of care to protect lives, contravenes international law.

The EFN calls on the Russian leaders to respect the work of nurses and midwives and all health professionals in Ukraine and the neutrality of healthcare institutions and healthcare professionals.

The EFN is in solidarity with its Ukrainian colleagues, their families, citizens and neighbours and demands an immediate end of the military conflict and hostilities in Ukraine.

The EFN will meet on 2 March with key EU and International nursing stakeholders, as the International Council of Nurses (ICN), the European Federation of National Nursing and Midwifery Associations (EFNNMA) and WHO Europe, to discuss the ongoing conflict and explore the ways in which we can support our nursing colleagues, ensure access to healthcare and promote peace through a unified nursing response.

In solidarity with Ukrainian nursing leaders and all colleagues in neighbouring countries, we stand together to condemn the military action and proactively support the protection of life and liberty.
